ORDINANCE NO. 1034

AN ORDINANCE REVISING CERTAIN STREET SPECIFICATION STANDARDS
OF THE VILLAGE OF GEORGETOWN, BROWN COUNTY, OHIO

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 956, adopted January 27, 2000, the Council of the Village of Georgetown adopted certain street specification standards pursuant to which dedicated public streets would be accepted by the Village of Georgetown as a part of the street and road system of the Village of Georgetown and thereafter maintained by it; and

WHEREAS, among other standards, said Ordinance No. 956 specified that all streets and roads must have at least a fifty (50) foot right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, Council now believes that said specifications should be revised to permit a type of road as a part of the Village of Georgetown street and road system of less than fifty (50) feet under limited circumstances;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Georgetown, Brown County, Ohio two-thirds (2/3) or more of all members thereof concurring as follows, that:

SECTION 1. For purposes of this Ordinance, the following words shall be defined as follows:


(A) "Street" means a permanently designed way, open to general public use, which affords the principal means of access to abutting property, such as an avenue, place, drive, boulevard, highway and any other similar public thoroughfare., except an alley as defined in this Ordinance.

(B) "Alley" means an area reserved, used for or designed and intended to provide only a secondary means of access to any property abutting thereon.

SECTION 2. An Alley may be dedicated to and accepted as a part of the Village of Georgetown street and road system provided it has at least a _____ (25) foot right-of-way, _____ (14) foot width of base, _____ (12) wide approved bituminous surface and otherwise meets the specifications set forth in Ordinance No. 956 as now in effect or as hereafter amended.


SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest date allowed by law.
