

ORDINANCE NO. 241

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE ALL OF THAT PORTION OF HIGH STREET AND OHIO STREET LYING WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF MOORE'S ADDITION TO THE VILLAGE OF GEORGETOWN, OHIO.

Sec. 1. Be It Ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Georgetown, Brown County, Ohio, that, whereas, the whole of High Street and Ohio Street lying within the boundaries of Moore's Addition to the Village of Georgetown are wholly unimproved and of no public benefit by reason of the terrain and inaccessability from the other public thoroughfares of said village; and,

Whereas, Council, upon examination, is satisfied that there is good cause for a vacation of said portion of said street lying within Moore's Addition and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests of the public, and ought to be made therefore High Street running North from Blair Road to the North terminus of said street and Ohio Street from High Street East to the boundary of Moore's Addition be and the same are hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
