

ORDINANCE NO. 253

ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON CHERRY STREET AND ON MAIN STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF GEORGETOWN, OHIO: THE ERECTION OF APPROPRIATE SIGNS MARKING PLACES IN WHICH PARKING IS PROHIBITED: AND CREATING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Georgetown, Brown County, Ohio, as follows:

- Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing any vehicle, except for the purpose of discharging passengers, or the delivery of merchandise or other commodities, on Cherry Street between Green Street and the intersection of West Alley with said Cherry Street at the point where said West Alley intersects said Cherry Street on the south side thereof, and said prohibition against parking shall apply equidistant on both the north and the south sides of said Cherry Street in said Village of Georgetown, Ohio.
- Sec. 2. That it shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing any vehicle, except for the purpose of discharging passengers, on the West side of Main Street between Grant Avenue and Cherry Street, and any person discharging passengers from any vehicle within said designated area may stop said vehicle only long enough for a person to alight from or enter said vehicle.
- Sec. 3. By the term "Vehicle", it is hereby meant any passenger automobile, passenger bus, truck, motorcycle, motorbike, miltizer bike, wagon, cart, trailer, or semi-trailer, which may be used to attach to any motor vehicles, tractors or other conveyance used to convey persons or property.
- Sec. 4. That there shall be erected and maintained appropriate signs within the above two specific areas designating that there shall be no parking of any vehicle within said area at any time.
- Sec. 5. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Two Dollars (\$2.00) nor more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) plus the costs of prosecution for a first offense hereunder and not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) plus the costs of prosecution for a second or subsequent offense hereunder.
- Sec. 6. All ordinances heretofore adopted or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted in conflict with this ordinance be, and the same hereby are repealed.
- Sec. 7. That this ordinance is an emergency ordinance necessary for the public safety of the inhabitants of the Village of Georgetown, Brown County, Ohio, and shall be in full force and effect at the earliest period allowed by law.
